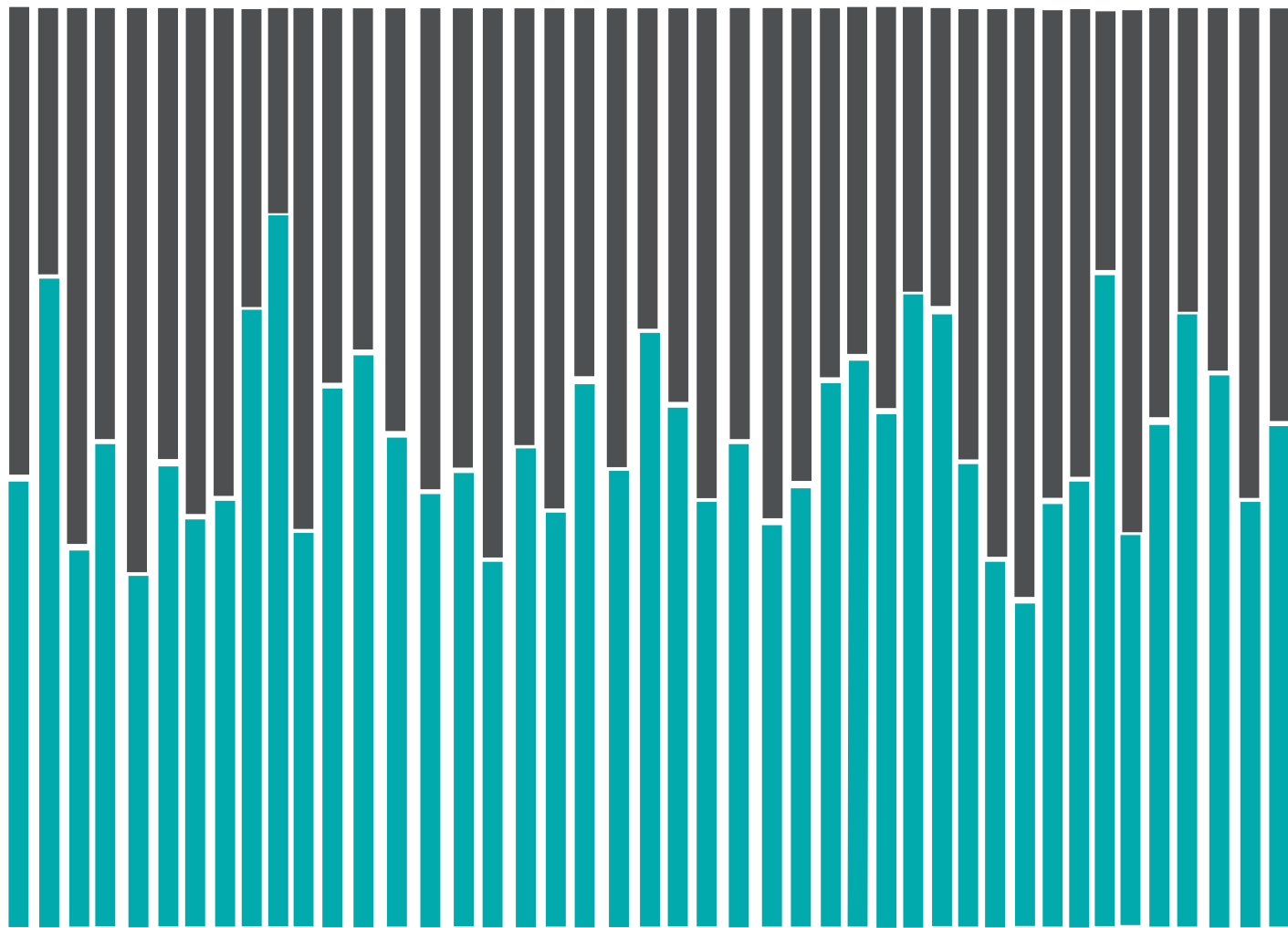

Guidelines for Submitting Artwork to the 120° Intercollegiate Regional

- Students must be currently enrolled at an accredited College or University, located within 120 miles of Saratoga Springs, Troy, or Glens Falls, New York. Students graduating in December 2016 are still eligible to apply.
- There is no entry fee for this exhibition.
- Applicants may submit up to 5 works for consideration.
- Artwork cannot exceed 60x60". Freestanding sculpture may exceed 60x60"; please check with Exhibitions Coordinator prior to submitting.
- All artwork must be original. Reproductions are not accepted.
- Printmaking and photography is permitted; prints must be in limited editions of 25 or less.
- Electronic and time-based media is permitted; the artist is responsible for providing all necessary equipment.

How to Apply

- Applicants must fill out the entry form online, which can be found at www.saratoga-arts.org/exhibitions/artistopportunities.
- Following the entry form, artists must e-mail their artwork images to 120ArtRegional@gmail.com with "[Your Name] 2017 Submission" in the subject line.
- Images must be a high quality JPEG format and be labeled accordingly with entry number. Ex: "Entry #1".
- Applicants submitting video can apply by sending their video via e-mail to the same address, and be MAC compatible.

Juror

All works will be juried by Guest Juror Ginger Ertz, Museum Educator at the Tang Teaching Museum & Art Gallery. The juror will select which pieces will be exhibited, as well as the three Juror's Choice Awards and three Honorable Mention Awards.

Delivery & Return of Artwork

- Artists must deliver artwork in person. If you are unable to deliver your work, an agent may do so ONLY with written permission to drop off/pick up work and sign the waiver/release on the artists' behalf.
- Sign waiver. Although Saratoga Arts treats all artwork with the utmost care and professionalism, we cannot be held responsible for theft or damage to artworks for our large group exhibitions. A waiver must be signed at drop off.
- All artwork must be framed and ready-to-hang.
- Saratoga Arts receives a 35% commission on all works sold in the gallery.
- Saratoga Arts does not store packing material.
- A limited number of postcards will be available to each participating artist.
- All work must be picked up on Saturday, April 21 from 11am-5pm or or Monday, April 23 from 9am-6pm.
- Artists are subject to a storage fee for late pick-up.
- All artwork must remain on display for the duration of the exhibit, March 4 - April 21, and may not be removed early.
